

July *NEWS* from Chamber President Wendy Kernan

Well, half of the year is behind us and as business owners we might start thinking of efficiencies that we can do to help our business for the second half of year. Payroll can be one of the areas to look at. One reason is not only can it be very time consuming but a real headache as well. You could use this time to work on your business and drive revenue instead of behind a desk doing paperwork. Here are some things to think about or ask different payroll providers about:

- 1. Whether you are doing payroll yourself or looking for a payroll provider, make sure your employee information is correct. It is easier to correct now than at the end of the year when W2s are being prepared. Double check names, addresses, SSN, make sure marital status or dependent information has not changed. (A lot of times an employee will forget to update this information when their status changes remember this applies to you too.)
- 2. All taxable income needs to be reported. That includes tips & bonuses (cash and non cash). Keep your payroll provider updated on any reimbursements as well that may need to be reported (example moving reallocations, company vehicle or business cell phone are all things to consider).
- 3. Whether you think about having a payroll provider or not, seriously consider how you are paying your employees. Things to consider are frequency and whether you are paying current or in arrears. Both of these items can save you some time by changing.
- 4. The last thing to think about are your reports. Are you getting what you need when you need it? Payroll providers can create and send you any report you need. The key is to make sure you are looking these over and doing a comparison quarter to quarter and YTD. This is a big one for both owners and managers.

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



Dear Community Members:

For over 35 years the Mt. Zion Community Children's Christmas Fund has helped to provide gifts to children in need in the Mt. Zion school district. Over the years the need within the community has grown tremendously and we have reached the point where we cannot continue in the manner, we have become accustomed. Therefore, we will not be providing Christmas gifts to children in 2019 in the way we previously have.

We plan to continue the Mt Zion Community Children's Fund as a year around mission, with the assistance of the school's social workers, counselors, and other staff. When a need is identified, the staff member will request funds identifying the child's need—whether it be shoes, clothes, school supplies, etc. The fund will then provide gift cards to the employee so that the needs can be met.

While this has been a very difficult decision, we feel it is the best way to continue helping Mt Zion children who need assistance.
